This week, we are looking at different types of lines. Watch this video about horizontal and vertical lines. The video also tells you about diagonal and other lines!



There are specific mathematical reasons behind horizontal and vertical lines but in Year 3, we say that horizontal lines go across, left and right (like a horizon) and vertical lines go up and down. It's important to remember that these lines don't slope! They are completely straight.


