The Work of the Governing Body

An important aspect of Governance is to ensure we see first-hand the decisions being made by the school leaders and the positive impact they are having on School Development.

Our role is primarily strategic we are not involved in the day to day running of the school and work in many areas to try and improve standards.

Together with the Headteacher and Senior Leadership Team we set the budget, oversee the curriculum and encourage positive links between school and community.

We also meet with both the Leadership Team and other staff in committees such as Full Governing Body; Resources and Behaviour for Learning. A vital aspect of these committees is to challenge the school regarding its finances, data outcomes and in particular, teaching and learning.

During the Autumn Term we have made many school visits, linked to the following areas; Safeguarding; SEND; Health and Safety of the school; Teaching and Learning including EYFS provision; Digital Technology, Human Resources and the More Able Children Governor Research Programme.

Some Governors also have undertaken Learning Walks and Book Looks, as well as meeting subject leaders. All Governors report back to the Governing Body and Leadership Team regarding their findings.

Finally, Michael Parker is the named representative for the Governing Body who attends Parents Forum and Sue Tysall meets the School Improvement Team regularly, this team comprises of outside stakeholders who challenge our school.

Governors seek to attend as many school events as possible, including EYFS- Open Morning, Summer Fete / Christmas Fair, and School Performances. We are very grateful for the active support provided by all members of Friends of Poverest.

AFACT

We have been impressed with the collaboration between our **AFACT Schools** and their Headteachers. They meet fortnightly together to support the further development of our trust.

We look forward to working more closely with our AFACT partners during the Spring term. We will be getting together with the other Governing Bodies to share ideas and learn from each other, completing some joint training, working to embed **collaborative values** across all Governing Bodies and Schools as a team.
