



Sports Premium Spending 2025-2026 Report

During the 2024/2025 academic year, Poverest Primary School received £20,350 as a Sports Premium. During the academic year 2025/2026 Poverest Primary School received £20,350 as Sports Premium.

Within Poverest Primary School, all children take part in at least two hours of physical education per week. Sports Premium money is used to improve the quality of PE and ensure all children are engaged in quality physical education. PE and Sport is valued and promoted across the school. Children, parents and staff gain improved confidence, knowledge and skill set in participation and teaching of physical education.

Top Up Swimming Summer term 2025	Top up swimming has continued this year and with children in year 5 and 6 participating. This has meant only 12 children in year 6 have needed top-up classes for 2025/26	Budget £680 Spent: £420
Full-time PE specialist	Each year group had the opportunity to have specialist sports coaches throughout the year. Staff were encouraged to teach at least one of these specialist lessons or to team-teach with the coach.	Total Budget £4,600 Spent £5,000
Dance Teacher	Each year group had dance lessons for at least half a term, which meant that by the end of the year, all aspects of the PE national curriculum had been covered. The Kapow scheme of work had not published the PE scheme of work and so we introduced a dance teacher to follow the National Curriculum. This was such a huge success and a highlight for many children that we have continued to employ a dance teacher who will teach dance from R-yr6 throughout the year	Budget: £4,500 Spent: £2,887.50
Specialist sports coaches	The children have been given a wide opportunity to engage in Sports with teachers who are specialised in Lacrosse and Tennis. This allows a wider range of skills to be learnt across the year and piques children's interests in lacrosse and tennis clubs provided by the school.	Budget: £1,080 Spent: £2,971.80
Cross Country Entry	Unfortunately there was not much of an uptake for the Cross Country this year but we hope for more children to be participating next year	Budget: Total: £180 Spent £90
PE Shed	The PE staff now have a new shed which is used to organise outdoor games and fielding equipment. This makes it quicker and easier for the PE team to set up when based outside and allows for the PE cupboards to be specifically for indoor PE equipment such as the gymnastics equipment. Langley Park School Games Buy	This allows us to enter school sporting competitions and access CPD for sports staff to continue expanding our PE curriculum	Budget £750 Spent £750
